Ferdinand Porsche founded his engineering office in Stuttgart.

Type 7

The first large order for a Porsche development was the Type 7.

Type 22

Construction of the grand-prix race car Type 22 for the Auto Union.

German People's Car

Exposé of a German People's Car.

Stuttgart-Zuffenhausen

Move to Porsche plant in Stuttgart-Zuffenhausen.

Type 360 "Cisitalia"

Grand-prix race car Type 360 "Cisitalia" under the leadership of Ferry Porsche.

The 356 "No. 1" Roadster

The 356 "No. 1" Roadster was the first sports car named Porsche and was built in Gmünd in Austria.

Series production of the 356

Porsche returned to Zuffenhausen for series production of the 356.

Class victory

Class victory at Porsche's first start at Le Mans.

Under the leadership of Ferry Porsche, the sports cars from Zuffenhausen became an export success.

Porsche 911

After its world Premiere as the 901, the Porsche 911 became an icon.

First overall victory at Le Mans

Porsche took first overall victory at the Le Mans with the Porsche 917 KH.

Weissach Development Center

Porsche opened the Weissach Development Center.

911 Carrera RSR Turbo 2.1

The 911 Carrera RSR Turbo 2.1 was the first 911 with a turbo engine in motor racing.

Transaxle era

Transaxle era: After last year's 924, the 928 was at times considered as the 911's successor.

A triple victory at Le Mans

A triple victory at Le Mans heralded the success story of the perennial winner Porsche 956.

The technology showpiece 959

The 959 shaped further Porsche development as a technology showpiece.

The Porsche Carrera Cup

The Porsche Carrera Cup was the first cup especially for the 911.

Greater cost efficiency

Porsche was in crisis and was streamlining production and processes for greater cost efficiency.

Entry-level model Boxster

With the entry-level model Boxster, Porsche drove out of the crisis.

Third model series Cayenne

Start of production for the third model series Cayenne from Leipzig.

Panamera

Porsche presented the four-door Gran Turismo Panamera.

19th overall victory at Le mans

Porsche clinched 19th overall victory at Le Mans and hat-trick for the 919 Hybrid.
